

Know that the Northern Health Authority and First Nation Health Authority carry this mandate and to this effect it is gratifying to communicate that two new physicians will be joining the Fort St James Medical Clinic in the Spring of 2023. In addition, the First Nation Health Authority is developing an innovative multidisciplinary health and wellness center to augment the needs of the community. Also be aware that your talented and dedicated fellow citizens who comprise the Fort St James Primary Care Society stand alongside you to continue the day-to-day operation of the Fort St James Medical Clinic including its same-day Acute Care Clinic services.
